HOW WE USE THE MONEY WE RAISE

Each year United Way of the Capital Region raises money to fund programs and services that make our community a better place to live and work. Listed below is how we allocated funds for our 2022–2023 program year.



School Readiness: \$792,450



Access to Health Care: \$800,475



Workforce Development: \$636,350

BASIC NEEDS

Housing, Utilities, Child Care, Information/Referral and Language Support: \$1,250,000

Support Hub: \$429,718 - Provides services to working families such as transportation, language support, child care, financial counseling, and information and referral. It also supports ALICE information (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed), basic needs research, strategic planning and child abuse clearances.

United Way Services: \$1,125,203 - Includes programs and services provided directly by United Way, such as the Volunteer Center, Money in Your Pocket, community outreach and program staffing.

Raised on Behalf of Other Nonprofits (Donor Designations): \$3,160,129
